TRANSITIONAL HOUSING

Assistance is available to victims of domestic violence who live independently and who are not in need of emergency shelter. Transitional Housing offers women and families the opportunity to rent one of five apartments where they receive domestic violence case management and advocacy services.

Transitional Housing Services Include:

- Five apartments available for women and families to rent (maximum 18 months)
- Individual Advocacy
- Financial assistance with first months rent, security deposit, or utility shut-off for victims of domestic violence who live independently or in one of the Transitional Housing apartments
- Assistance with locating and obtaining permanent, affordable housing
