CASE MANAGEMENT

TRANSITIONAL HOUSING

Assistance is available to victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking who live independently and who are not in need of emergency shelter. Transitional Housing offers victims and families the opportunity to rent one of four apartments where they receive case management and advocacy services.

Transitional Housing Services Include:

- Four apartments available for victims and families to rent (maximum 18 months)
 - Individual Advocacy
 - Financial assistance with first months rent, security deposit, or utility shut-off for victims who live independently or in one of the Transitional Housing apartments
 - Assistance with locating and obtaining permanent, affordable housing
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
