Our Future Depends On You!

"Americans are recycling more and throwing away less," according to a report released by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency on October 23,2006.

In 2005, the U.S. recycled 32 percent of its waste. Including composting, Americans recycled 79 million tons, representing a 2 percent increase from 2004 and a huge jump from 16 percent in 1990.

In all, Americans generated nearly 246 million tons of municipal solid waste in 2005— a decrease of nearly 2 million tons from 2004. The decrease is due in part to the decline in individual waste generated to about 4.5 pounds per person per day, representing a 1.5 percent decrease from 2004. in addition to generating less waste, individuals recycled nearly 1.5 pounds per day.
