Welcome Back to School

For many families, back to school planning will look different this year than it has in previous years. Your school will have new policies in place to prevent the spread of COVID-19. You may also be starting the school year with virtual learning components. Whatever the situation, these checklists are intended to help parents, guardians, and caregivers, plan and prepare for the upcoming school year.

- Check in with your child each morning for signs of illness. If your child has a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher, they should not go to school.
- Make sure your child does not have a sore throat or other signs of illness, like a cough, diarrhea, severe headache, vomiting, or body aches.
- If your child has had close contact to a COVID-19 case, they should not go to school. Follow guidance on what to do when someone has known exposure.
- Identify your school point person(s) to contact if your child gets sick
- Make sure your child is up-to-date with all recommended vaccines, including for flu. All school-aged children should get an influenza flu vaccine every season.
- Talk to your child about precautions to take at school.
- Make sure your information is current at school, including emergency contacts and individuals authorized to pick up your child(ren) from school.
- Develop a plan as a family to protect household members who are at increased risk for severe illness

Keep it Clean with James Neff

Housing Maintenance will only be mowing lawns for elders (persons 62 years older) and/or disabled (unless there is an able bodied person living in your unit). If you do not fall within these guidelines, you will be responsible for mowing your own lawn. Please keep your lawn mowed and free of debris.

Rental fee for a lawn mower is \$10.00 at Housing.

LAWN CARE also includes raking and picking up debris.

Residential Curbside Collection Service

Weekly curbside collection

(1) 96 gallon container per residence



Includes I large item (list follows) or up to 4 extra bags

- Furniture item
- Three (3) passenger tires off the rim
- Appliance
- Water heater
- Washer
- Dryer
- Dry carpeting cut into four foot lengths or less, tied and securely bundled
- Construction material cut into four foot lengths or less, tied and securely bundled.
- Three (3) passenger car tires off the rim
- All other bulk items must be boxed or bundled weighing no more than 50 lbs. each, with a maximum of four feet.
- Refrigerators and other appliances that contain or once contained Freon or other types of coolant must have Freon/coolant removed by a certified contractor, who must affix a certification sticker to each unit indicating the Freon/coolant has been removed prior to collection. This is not an allinclusive list of items requiring special attention.
- ⇒ Waste must be curbside by 6:00 am the day of pickup
- ⇒ Driver not responsible for waste that is not properly bagged or secured
- ⇒ If additional bins are needed the resident will be responsible for the additional cost
