I am originally from the U.P and decided to move to Mt. Pleasant to further my education back in 2012. I was able to successfully graduate with a Bachelor of Science degree in Sociology with a concentration in Criminal lustice and a double minor in Substance Abuse: Prevention, Education, and Treatment and in Leadership. Chips! With that, I was able to land an internship at Behavioral Health and ever since landing that position-I have continued to work in this community. Some of the wonderful opportunities I have had here locally have been working for Behavioral Health and the Tribal Courthouse, which is where I fell in love with outreach, specifically with the Native American population.

To better assist the community, I would love to explain some of the responsibilities involving my position. It is our goal to be able to provide instruction, guidance, assistance, and crisis intervention to help increase our client's self-sufficiency and help prevent any neglect/abuse towards children and adults. Some of the things that MDHHS has to offer are food assistance, childcare, Medicaid, cash assistance, and State Emergency Relief which can include home repairs, utility bills, and burial assistance. Besides assisting with applications, I can help arrange transportation to medical appointments, Social Security Office, or other outside agencies that may help you during your time of need. The Indian Outreach Worker is also responsible to mandate the Indian Child Welfare Act for Native American families, attorneys, community members, local agencies, DHHS staff, and others.
