

Isaac grew up hunting, fishing and trapping.
Many of these years were spent learning from
Elders in the northern regions of Alberta,
Saskatchewan and Manitoba. Isaac is well
respected as a storyteller and traditional
knowledge holder. For many years he has
led various workshops and cultural camps that
focus on the transfer of knowledge to youth.



Other areas of expertise include: traditional Ojibwe paint, imagery/symbolism, harvesting, medicine walks, ceremonial knowledge, cultural camps, Anishinaabek oral history, birch bark canoe making, birch bark scrolls, Youth & Elders workshops, etc. He has committed his life to the preservation of Anishinaabe cultural practices and has spent years learning directly from Elders. http://onamancollective.com/who-we-are/
