Marie is from the Odawa tribe from Wikwemikong First Nation Reserve located on Manitoulin Island. She has two daughters and five grandchildren. Marie is a carrier of her father's WWII Midewin Eagle staff. Being a Grandmother of a grandmother's pipe has enabled her to continue teaching culture across Native America. She also holds a Bachelor's of Education from Nipissing University in North Bay, Ontario.

WILLIE TRUDEAU

Willie is Ojibwe & Odawa from the Wikwemikong Reserve on Manitoulin Island. He is a graduate from Laurentian University. He is a craftsman in beadwork, quill work, and wood working. He dances as a traditional dancer and is a 3rd degree in the minoowewiigan midewin lodge. He also has two daughters and five grandchildren.
