His first book, forthcoming in the Spring of 2020, is on the history and future of Indigenous leadership. He explores how three chiefs, Pontiac, Tecumseh

and Shingwauk, perceived their roles and responsibilities during some of the most challenging periods in the history of North America.



Patricia Shawnoo, Ogitchida Quay is a descendant of Chief Tecumseh and Keeper of the Tecumseh Eagle Staff. As a Water Carrier, she "shares stories, gives life and defends the land for future generations."
