Do you know where your children are or will be AFTER a disaster?

- After Hurricane Katrina more than 3,000 children were missing.
- It took six months to get the last child back home to her family.

Many think we are safe from major disaster in Michigan. Here are just a few recorded disasters in our state:

- April 11, 1965: 7 p.m., 44 dead and 612 injured.

 The death toll: Branch County (19), Hillsdale County (11), Lenawee County (14).
- June 8, 1953: 8:30 p.m., 115 dead and 844 injured.

 A devastating tornado moved east across the north part of Flint, obliterating homes on Coldwater Road.
- May 8, 1964: 4:59 p.m., 11 dead and 224 injured.

 A short, wide and intense tornado cut across the Anchor Bay area, north of Mt. Clemens.
- May 13, 1980: 2:58 p.m., 5 dead and 79 injured

 This tornado moved east following Main Street into the center of Kalamazoo; 47 homes were destroyed.
