Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the opening of the community-curated MMIWG changing exhibition was postponed.

The red dresses that were installed throughout the community to recognize MMIWG have been taken down. These dresses, representing countless MMIWG, need to be ceremonially and respectfully burned with an offering of food and tobacco to send them to the Spirit World. A sacred fire will be lit on the west side of the Ziibiwing Center.

Ziibiwing invites interested community members to join us and make your own prayer offering to the fire. A Grandmother Buffalo skull will be present for the community to help get “dressed” and feasted for future Thirsty (Sun) Dance ceremonial work.

- Please wear your face mask. Physical distancing will be expected.
- The Tribal Historic Preservation Office/Ziibiwing will provide grab bags of fresh cedar and sage for you to take for personal or office use.
