A newly approved wolf hunting season will commence on November 15th, 2013. Many Michigan wolves will be hunted on this day due to a change of laws that once protected our brothers.

Join supporters of Wolf Protection at the SCA School Lodge on November 14th, 2013 (the eve before the wolf hunt opens) for a candle light vigil and sacred fire. Let us at least share our brother's story and offer semaa (tobacco) before ma'iiganag (wolves) are senselessly slaughtered again.
