INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING "PETITION FOR PERSONAL PROTECTION ORDER" (NON-DOMESTIC RELATIONSHIP)

Saginaw Chippewa Tribal Court

If you are experiencing harassment and/or stalking, you may be entitled to Personal Protection Order (PPO). A PPO is intended to provide protection if you are experiencing harassment or stalking from a person with whom you do not share a family or household or intimate relationship.

If you do share a family or household relationship with the other person, please ask for a Domestic PPO instruction sheet.

To request a PPO from the Tribal Court, you must first complete a **Petition for Personal Protection Order**.

By filling out a petition for Personal Protection Order, you are asking the Tribal Court to issue an order prohibiting the other person (the "respondent") from doing certain things, such as making any contact with you, coming near your personal residence or workplace, contacting you through third parties, making threats or harming you in any way, or causing damage to your property. If a protection order is issued and later violated by the respondent, he/she may be subject to arrest and other sanctions, including imprisonment.

By law, a personal protection order may only be issued if certain requirements are met.

Under Saginaw Chippewa Tribal law, Stalking includes "a willful course of conduct involving repeated or continuing harassment of another individual that would cause a reasonable person to feel or actually causes to feel terrorized, frightened, intimidated, threatened, and/or harassed." Saginaw Chippewa Tribal Code 1.2501 (2)

The Court requires an affidavit that sets out facts constituting reasonable cause to believe that the respondent may commit an act of stalking against you. Describe the most recent acts against you by the respondent. This can be multiple incidents over a period of time, including non-physical acts that caused fear. It is helpful to include descriptive and specific language about the violence or harassment you have experienced, including discussion of your feelings of fear.

If you are in immediate danger, you should ask the judge for an "Ex-Parte" Order, which means that the personal protection order could be issued without waiting for a hearing. With an ex parte order, the respondent won't know you're asking for a PPO until after you get your order.

Completing the Petition for Personal Protection Order

Items (A-B) 1 through 12 must be completed before the Petition for Personal Protection Order can be filed. Please read the instructions for each item and fill in the information on the form as accurately and thoroughly as possible. Please print neatly.



 (\widehat{A}) Write your name, address, and phone number in the "Petitioner" box. If you are under 18 years of age, write your age. Write the name, address, and phone number of the person you want restrained in the "Respondent" box; if he/she is under 18 years of age, write his/her age. Be certain to fill in Respondent identifiers as much as possible for Police data entry and ID purposes.

If you want your address and phone number to be kept from the respondent, do not write your address. Ask for a separate confidential address form.

- 1) Check that this form properly describes the relationship between you (petitioner) and the respondent.
- 2) Indicate whether the respondent and the petitioner are American Indian and include the Tribal affiliation, if known.

- 3) Indicate whether or not allegations/actions did or did not occur within the jurisdiction on the Isabella or Saganing reservation.
- 4) Indicate if there are any pending or resolved court cases between you and the respondent. If there are, please note the case number, the name of the court and tribe/state/province, and the judge's name.
- 5) Check the box to indicate whether you (petitioner) reside on tribal land or not.
- 6) Check the box to indicate whether or not the respondent lives on tribal land. If you don't know, check "his/her residence is unknown."
- 7) Check if the respondent has a concealed firearm carry permit and/or is required by law to carry a firearm while at work.
- 8) Check "unknown" if you do not know whether respondent is allowed or required if to carry a firearm.
- 9) Explain as thoroughly and in as much detail as possible why you are asking for a PPO. Describe what has happened so that the judge has enough facts to decide if an order should be signed. Describe any previous/separate instances of abuse, threats, or any other acts that caused you to feel terrorized, frightened, intimidated, threatened, and/or harassed. Include dates and places. Write on a separate sheet of paper and attach it to this form, if necessary. A tribal victim advocate is available to answer any questions and to assist you complete and file the Petition.

- 10) a. Check the boxes next to the protections you want included in the PPO and fill in any blank spaces with the required information. Include in your written explanation to the judge why you need these protections.
 - b. Check box indicating sexual assault under Saginaw Chippewa Tribal Code 1.2402(c).
 - c. Check box for usage of electronic communications.
- 11) a. Check the box requesting an "ex parte order" if you believe the respondent might hurt you between now and the time a hearing may be granted, or if you think that the respondent might hurt you when he or she is given notice of a scheduled hearing. An "ex parte order" means you do not have to let the other party know in advance that you are asking the court for an order and you do not have to wait for a court hearing to get an order. Include in the space provided and explain in writing why an ex-parte order is needed. (attach additional sheets if necessary)
 - b. If you are granted the ex parte order the respondent has 14 days to request a hearing. You and the respondent will need to be present at this hearing. If you request an ex parte order and the judge denies it, the court will schedule a hearing. Make sure to check one of the boxes to let the court know what you want to happen if the ex parte order is denied.
- 12) If someone other than the victim is filing this petition, check a "next friend" is filing for the petitioner.
- (B.) Write in today's date and sign the form. If someone other than the victim is filing the form, that person will sign the form as Next Friend.

When you have completed the form, provide it to the Court Clerk. He/she will complete the form and provide copies.
