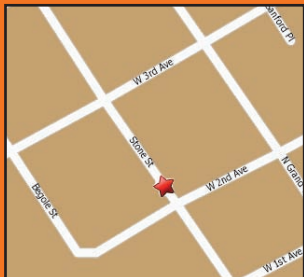

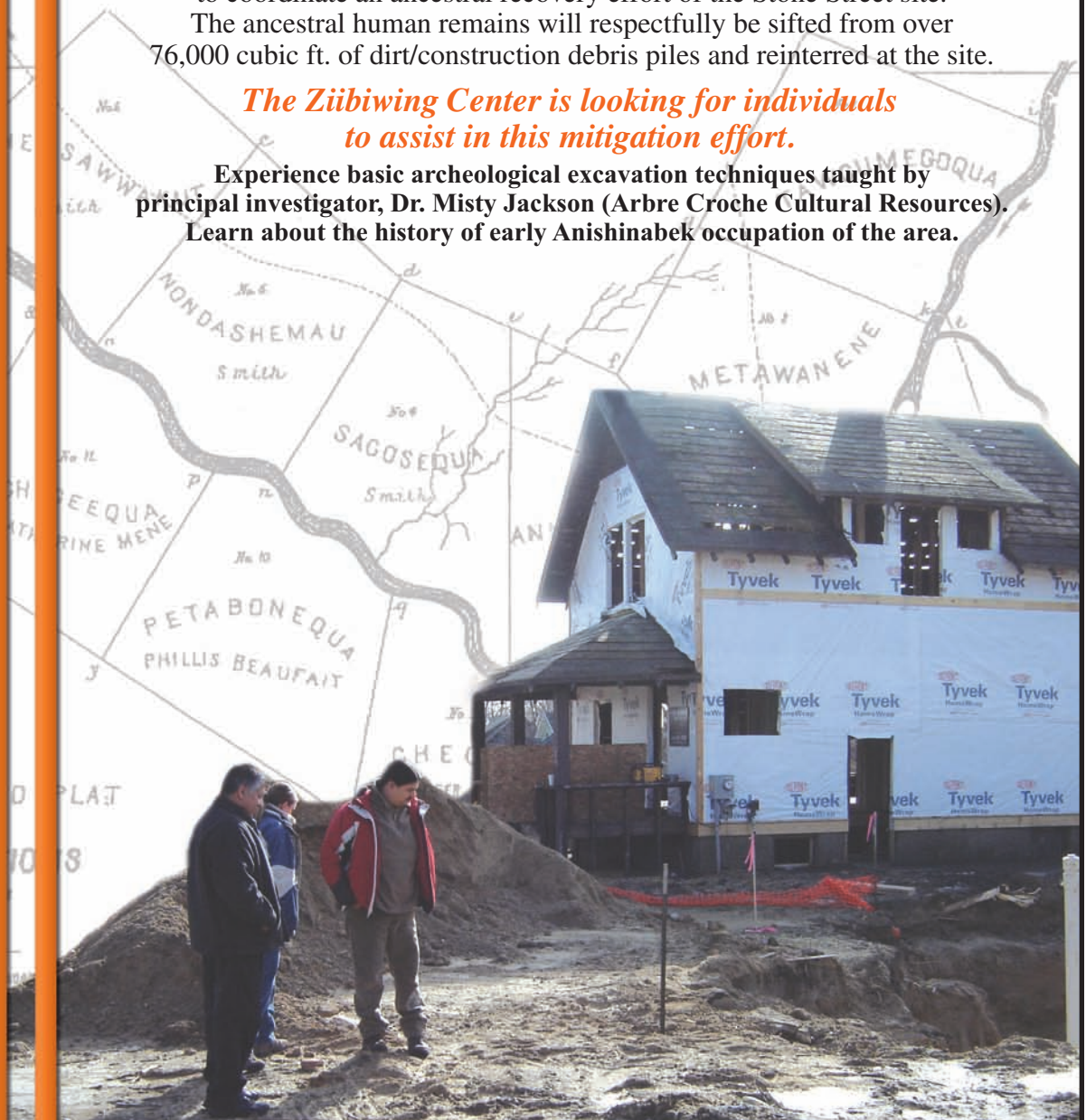
# WE NEED VOLUNTEERS!

The Ziibiwing Center has been given authority by the Saginaw Chippewa Tribal Council and the Genesee County Land Bank to coordinate an ancestral recovery effort of the Stone Street site. The ancestral human remains will respectfully be sifted from over 76,000 cubic ft. of dirt/construction debris piles and reinterred at the site.
