The Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe of Michigan and its Ziibiwing Center of Anishinabe Culture & Lifeways, in partnership with the Michigan Anishinaabek Cultural Preservation and Repatriation Alliance, will repatriate the ancestral human remains of 44 Native American individuals and 3 associated funerary objects from Wayne State University, Detroit, Michigan; 1 Native American individual from the Michigan State Police Post #63, Mt. Pleasant, Michigan; and 81 Native American individuals and 6 associated funerary objects from the University of Michigan's Museum of Anthropology (UMMA), Ann Arbor, Michigan.

The Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe of Michigan invites the public to join with us for these important repatriation activities to increase a collective understanding and awareness of Native American ancestral issues.


