The Ziibiwing Center is home to an impressive collection of Anishinaabek historical and contemporary personal artifacts. The artistic traditions of the Anishinaabek were best expressed in the decoration of clothing and the detailing of utilitarian objects. Bracelets, earrings, necklaces and other objects used in daily life were adorned with manufactured glass beads, porcupine quills, silk ribbon and silver.

On February 7th, join William Johnson, Curator of the Ziibiwing Center, for this special exhibit that will showcase the ever-evolving artistic expression and creativity of the Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe of Michigan and the Great Lakes Anishinaabek.
