

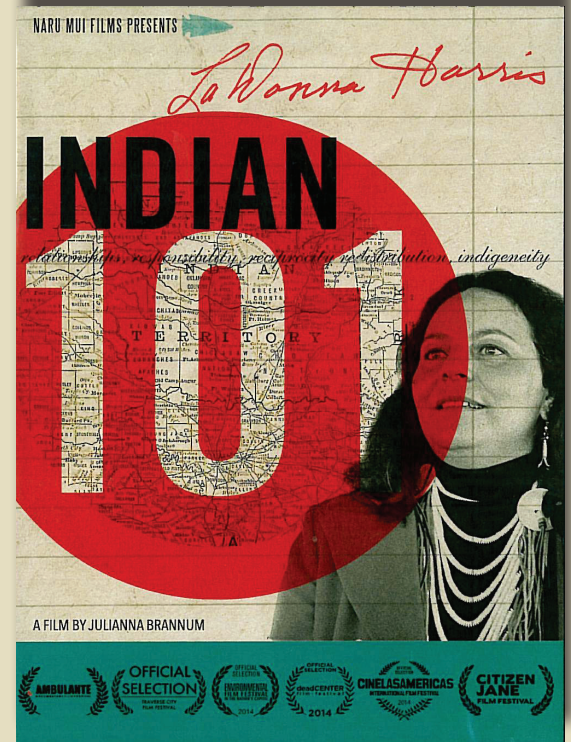
INDIGENOUS PEOPLE'S DAY
