NINDAKENJIGEWINOONG "The place where you find things out." THE RESEARCH CENTER at ZIIBIWING

The Nindakenjigewinoong Research Center at Ziibiwing is a treasure of historical and genealogical information. Although it is not a genealogical repository, it can be very useful in researching family histories. Some items available to view at the Research Center are Allotment and Annuity rolls, Census records, the Gruett List, the Durant Roll and approximately 102 probate (land record) files. Also available is the online Library Edition of the genealogical site, *HeritageQuest*. In addition, a collection of materials compiled by ethnohistorian, Dr. James McClurken, is also available and indexed in a "Calendar of Research."

The Ziibiwing Center is known for its immense collection of historic records and documents which includes a Rare and Special Book Collection, photographs, various issues of periodicals and small collections.

A bank of public access computers is available to search for North American Indian news, history and other genealogical sites with a printer available for hard copies at a small per copy fee. There are comfortable tables and seating for 20+ patrons with electric and internet access via floor ports for laptop users. There is also a copy machine and microfilm machine available to help with your research needs.



The Ziibiwing Center is equipped with state-of-the-art systems for securing and preserving each individual piece of the collection with a security system with alarms, collections that are monitored on video surveillance cameras, items stored in acid-free boxes and other appropriate packing materials, fire-proof file cabinets and flat map cabinets. The collections are maintained under ideal environmental control for long life.
