To HONOR & RESPECT Wednesday, June 29, 2016 Anishinabe Ancestral Repatriation Observance

The Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe of Michigan (SCT) and its Ziibiwing Center of Anishinabe Culture & Lifeways will repartiate the physical ancestral remains of, at minimum, two individuals who have been determined to be culturally affiliated with the SCTI. In 1915, these remains were removed from a site three miles northwest of Byron, Burns Total Schwarz, Schwa

Museum in 1915. The Peabody Museum of Archaeology and Ethnology (PMAE) at Harvard University records describe the site three miles northwest of Byron, MI, as "Mound 1" and "Ojibwa Historic Burial Site, Keetchewandaugnink Reservation The reservation encompasses a validge site of the same name that was established circa 1810. The reservation itself was established by the Treaty of Saginaw in September 1819, and ceded in 1837 after a small pox epidemic. The preservamounds and graves near the Keetchewanudaugnink village site are known from historic accounts. An early written history of Slaiwassee County indicates that a large cemetery was known to be associated with the Keetchewanudaugnink Village. The U.S. Department of Interior Burenot of Indian Afthirs (RJA) and PMAE, in consultation with representatives of the Saginary Chippewa Indian Tribe of Michigan, concur that the Keetchewanudaugnink Reservation was an early reservation of the Saginaw Chippewa in the historic period.
