## Presenter: Roger LaBine

Lac Vieux Desert Band of Lake Superior Chippewa

Is an enrolled member of the Lac Vieux Desert Band of Lake Superior Chippewa (LVD) and employed in the Environmental and Planning Department as a Water Resource Technician. He is the recipient of the 2019 Michigan Heritage Award by the Michigan Traditional Arts Program of the University of Michigan and the State of Michigan.

He is the current tribal delegate on the Michigan Wild Rice Initiative (MWRI), Co-chairman of the MWRI Education & Outreach subcommittee, Co-Chairman of the Native Wild Rice Coalition, he was a member of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) Wolf Advisory Committee and a member of the MDNR Moose Advisory Committee, currently sits as member of the U.S. Ottawa National Forest Interpretive Association (OIA) Board.

Roger is an active member of the Three Fires Midewiwin Lodge. He is active in the preservation of Wild Rice through continued restoration efforts of rice beds for his community on traditional and historic tribal lands and in the surrounding area lakes and rivers in the ceded territories. He shares his knowledge through conducting Wild Rice Camps and workshops on his traditional homelands, and throughout the Midwest. He was inspired by his Uncle Niigzansah who was also his teacher and Mentor.
